- 2. President Fukuda called the meeting to order at 1:07 PM:
- 3. **Public Comments:** None.
- 4. **Approval of June Minutes:** A motion was made by Trustee Reyna, seconded by Trustee Lockhart and passed by 10 0 roll call vote to approve the minutes of the June 21, 2021 Board meeting.

- 5. **Approval of June Payroll:** A motion was made by Trustee Taylor, seconded by Trustee Esraelian and passed by 10-0 roll call vote to approve the June payroll checks having District numbers, 26193 26232, 26245 26247, 26249 26292 and 26301 26302 in the total amount of \$147,158.46.
- 6. **Approval of June Bills:** A motion was made by Trustee Lockhart, seconded by Trustee Cardenas and passed by 10 0 roll call vote to approve the June commercial checks having District numbers, 26159, 26232 26245, 26248, 26289 26290, 26293 26300 and 26302 26336 in the total amount of \$145,863.63.
- 7. **Sale of Surplus Vehicles:** Sealed bids for the sale of one 1999 Ford F150 truck, one 2004 Ford F150 truck, two 2007 Chevrolet Colorado 4WD trucks and one 2009 Chevrolet Colorado 4WD truck were received and opened. These bids are listed in Attachment A. A motion was made by Trustee Taylor, seconded by Trustee Esraelian and passed by 10 0 roll call vote to accept the highest, qualified bid for each vehicle, as determined by the District Manager.
- 8. **Disposition of Surplus Vehicles:** A motion was made by Trustee Reyna, seconded by Trustee Taylor and passed by a 10 0 roll call vote to declare as surplus property and to sell one 2003 Ford F250 (VIN 3FTNF20L33MB24842), one 2005 Ford F150 (VIN 1FTRF12W85NC02009), one 2006 Chevrolet Silverado (VIN 1GCDT14E978206935), one 2007 Chevrolet Colorado 4WD (VIN 1GCDT14E978206935), one 2009 Chevrolet Colorado 4WD (VIN 1GCDT14E898145466) and one 2009 Chevrolet Colorado 4WD (VIN 1GCDT14EX98146604).

A motion was made by Trustee Lockhart, seconded by Trustee Cardenas and passed by 9-1 roll call vote (Taylor opposed) to direct the Equipment Committee, the Manager and the Mechanic to set a minimum sale price for each vehicle and to advertise and sell the vehicles by sealed bids to the highest bidders.

- 10. **Report out of Closed Session:** A motion was made by Trustee Cardenas, seconded by Trustee Hill and passed by a 10 0 roll call vote to approve the sale of the Reedley Depot property, 1325 I Street, Reedley, APN 368-271-11T, by approving the Purchase and Sale Agreement with Samuel and Valerie Escobar for \$185,000 and to authorize both the Board President and/or District Manager to execute the Agreement, the Deed, escrow instructions and all documents necessary to facilitate the sale of the property and to close escrow.
- 11. **Employee Medical Health Benefits Plan:** A motion was made by Trustee Reyna, seconded by Trustee Esraelian and passed by a 10 0 roll call vote to approve payment of full premiums and Heath Savings Account contributions for regular employees, spouses and qualifying dependents for selected medical health plans through the Special District Risk Management Authority. Selected plans offered by the District are Blue Shield Anthem Blue Cross HDHP 20, Blue Shield Silver PPO and Kaiser HMO 20.

The District provides dental and vision benefits to regular employees through the Central California Vector Control Joint Powers Agency.

- 12. **Purchase of Heavy-Duty Trailer:** Price quotations for the purchase of a heavy-duty trailer were received from Carson Trailers and Big Tex Trailers. A motion was made by Trustee Lockhart, seconded by Trustee Esraelian and passed by 10 0 roll call vote to approve the purchase of a heavy-duty trailer from Carson Trailers for \$5,106.42.
- 13. **Preparation for Anniversary:** Trustee Cardenas left the meeting. The Manger discussed plans and preparations made by the staff anniversary planning committee and the Board was asked to review a tentative invitation list and to suggest additions.
- 14. **Board General Discussion:** President Fukuda read a letter dated July 14, 2021, from Karl Peterson to Clovis City Manager Luke Serpa stating that Mr. Peterson has resigned his appointment as trustee from the City of Clovis.

Trustee Taylor asked whether any employees were currently working remotely. The Manager responded that none were.

Trustee Taylor asked if there was progress in contracting a landscaper for the District facilities. The Manager responded that staff has been contacting prospective contractors.

15. **Staff Reports:** The Manager stated that CalPERS reported a preliminary 21.3% net return on investments for FY 2020 – 2021.

The Manager reported that a vehicle had crashed into and damaged the eastern property wall of the Clovis Depot and that it was repaired by District staff.

AGENDA ITEM 10: PURCHASE OF ICE MACHINE

Background:

District staff who work under field conditions, whether control operations or surveillance, are subject high temperatures. With safety protocols, the District is required to provide heat illness prevention training and provide for breaks from heat, shade and availability of hydration. Employees are encouraged to take frequent breaks from heat, have vehicles with air conditioning and are provided with drinking water containers. To provide for cold water at the headquarters facility, ice is provided with the use of a commercial grade ice machine. Currently, we do not have an ice machine at our Clovis Depot and other lesser arrangements are made such as purchase of ice.

A better arrangement for providing ice and cold drinking water for employees at Clovis, and to comply with heat illness prevention, would be the purchase and installation of a commercial ice machine at Clovis.

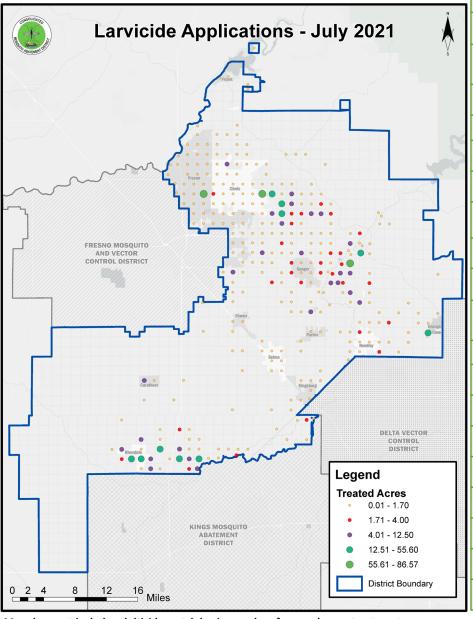

SURVEILLANCE

Orthopodomyia signifera

In the past 20 years this mosquito has only been collected on 11 separate trap nights. The collection prior to this July 2021 find was in August 2013 from a CO2 baited EVS trap identified by former Surveillance Assistant, Victor Maggi. Although this species is not medically important it's always a treat to collect this rare species.

In a *Vector of the Month* technical report written by retired District Entomologist, Charlie Smith wrote the following:

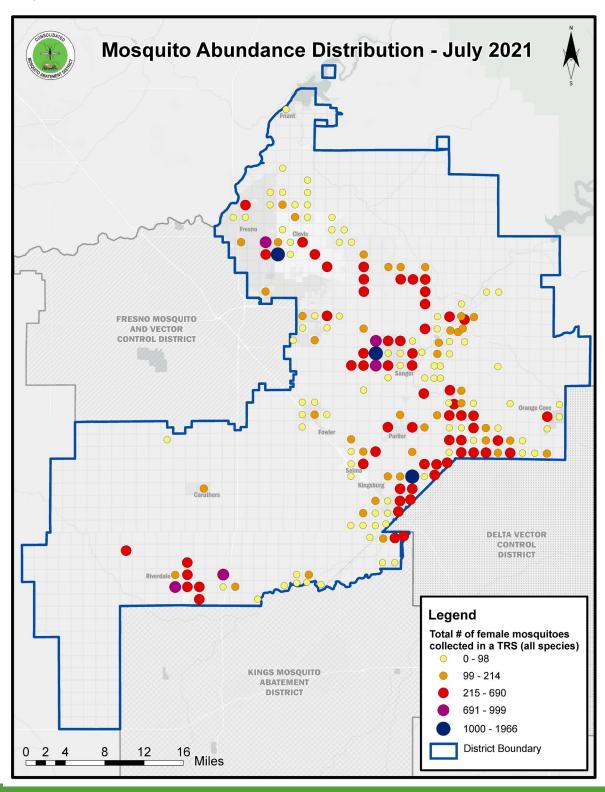
Among the treehole species of mosquitoes which inhabit California, *Orthopodomyia signifera* is the most unique. Whereas the more familiar Western treehole mosquito, *Aedes sierrensis*, is small and somewhat spotted-looking in the adult stage, *O. signifera* is similar in size to most mosquitoes and looks unlike any other species found in California. Its unique features include thin silvery lines of scales on the dorsal (top) side of the thorax and a speckling of broad white scales on the wings. These scales contrast with associated dark scales to make this mosquito highly attractive in appearance.

Distribution of *O. signifera* in California appears to be spotty and at lower elevations. Like *A. sierrensis*, eggs are laid singly above the water level on the insides of treeholes. Hatching occurs within a few days after rising water reaches the eggs. Whereas *A. sierrensis* can inhabit many species of trees holding temporary winter water, *O. signifera* is normally restricted to treeholes which contain water year-round. Larvae can be found throughout the year in such sources as oaks, cottonwoods, and willows. This species generally overwinters in the egg or larval stage. Adults tend to be long-lived with females preferring the blood of small birds.

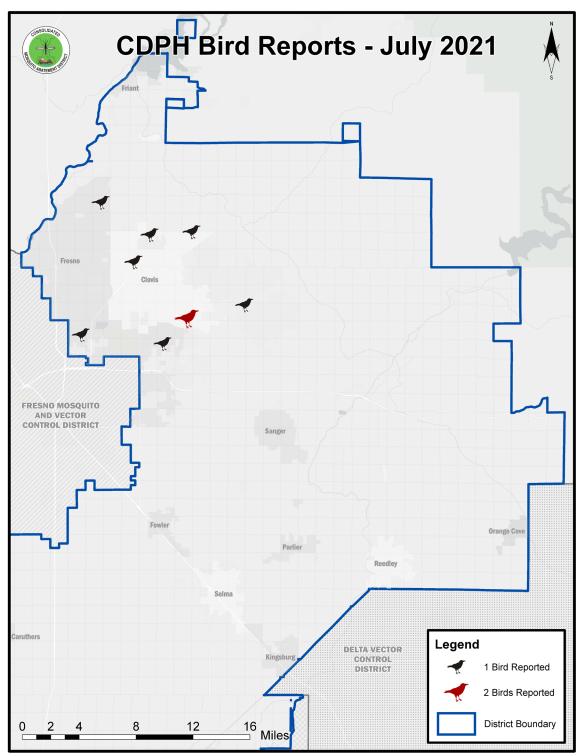

Birds: Nine birds were reported to the California Department of Public Health West Nile virus dead bird hotline within the District. Follow up surveillance was conducted at one location.

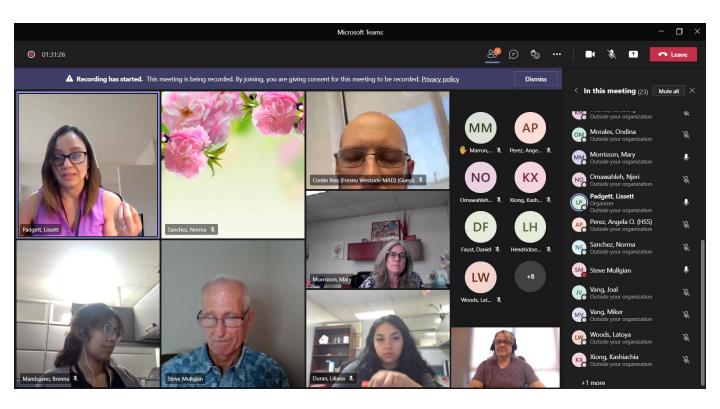


Community Partners

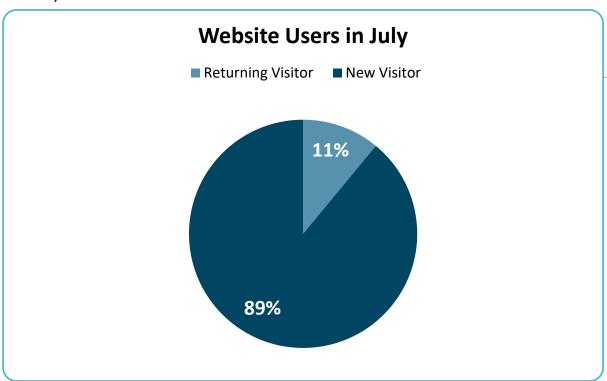
Community Presentations

On July 13th Science Education Coordinator Katherine Ramirez gave a 15-minute presentation to the Fresno County Communicable Disease Investigation (CDI) Unit, providing an update on disease response and mosquito abatement responsibilities. District Managers Steve Mulligan and Conlin Reis (Fresno Westside MAD) were also in attendance. Twenty-three people participated in the meeting providing the opportunity for MAD representatives to respond to numerous questions from CDI staff on mosquito control and disease response.

Outreach Events

The District participates in events throughout the year. At each event, District staff will set up an informational table equipped with a mosquito life cycle display, mosquitofish swimming in a tank, plant pot source examples, yard drain tube with lid and screen example, kids shoes to show residents how to keep mosquitoes out of house, educational handouts, and logoed giveaways.

The District participated in an outreach event at The Fresno Discovery Center on July 3rd. The informational table (top right photo) was staffed by Science Education Coordinator, Katherine Ramirez and volunteer KD Ramirez. District staff engaged with approximately 15 families. Children in attendance enjoyed the mosquito life cycle bean bag toss game.

The District also participated in the "Healthy Fresno County" night at the Fresno Grizzly Baseball game on July 24th. The informational table was staffed by Science Education Coordinator, Katherine Ramirez and GIS Coordinator, Conner Schaak (page 2). Approximately 80 residents were engaged by staff.
